

The following are just some of the ways in which a new Master Mason can become active at Rabboni Lodge, in the Sixth District, and in Freemasonry

### **Rabboni Lodge**

- Regularly attend monthly meetings
- Get involved with the blood giving program
- Tell friends and family about Rabboni Lodge, maybe evening recommending them for lodge membership; your Lodge Ambassador can assist you.
- Volunteer during Open House events typically held during March and October
- Assist in preparing for and implementing the Rabboni Lodge summer family outing
- Assist in preparing for and implementing the end of year holiday children's gift drive
- Offer to 'Sponsor' a new candidate
- During a future Lodge meeting, offer to give a short presentation on a subject of interest to you or reflective of your occupation
- Host a Masonic Information presentation at an organization where you belong; your Lodge Ambassador will be glad to be a guest presenter
- Assist in a community event
- Offer to get "In Line" as a junior officer. Lower level junior officers have little to no speaking or "floor work" activities
- Work toward attaining the Master Rookie Award; the Lodge Ambassador will assist you

### **Sixth District**

- Support district activities by attending events or better still, helping to organize or 'work' the event
- Donate blood at a Masonic blood drive
- Attend Lodge of Instruction
- Assist with logistics associated with Lodge of Instruction
- Visit other lodges. No need to go alone. If you would like to visit another lodge to see how they practice Freemasonry, contact the Lodge Ambassador, who can help find a Rabboni 'brother' to accompany you

### **Freemasonry**

- Practice friendship, morality, and brotherly love in all your roles and in every human relationship
- Volunteer to help at a local Child Identification Program (CHIP) event
- Tell friends and family about Freemasonry, maybe evening recommending them for membership close to where they live or work; your Lodge Ambassador can assist you.
- Visit Grand Lodge and take a tour. While there, be sure to visit the Masonic library and review the material available to all Massachusetts Freemasons eager to expand their understanding of the Fraternity
